Left Bank getting closer to opening venue

The folks behind the Left Bank Project are moving forward with a plan to open an event venue in a building neighboring their recently completed renovation of the Hazelwood building on North Broadway.

I spoke with project partner and designer Andy Powell today during a tour of the Left Bank building at 240 N. Broadway and he revealed that the neighboring building could become an event venue as soon as this fall. The 20,000-square-foot building was purchased by Left Bank owner Daniel Deustch four years ago and has been retrofitted and brought up to city code.

Powell says the building's top floor is one large open space that could cater to many different sorts of events, from conferences and private meetings to concerts and parties. Local sustainable caterer Bon Appetit also plans to locate a catering operation in the venue.

Construction on the raw space will include electrical and mechanical systems, construction of a mezzanine and tenant improvement work.
